

At Moxie, compliance is a top priority for you and your MedSpa. Each state has its own healthcare regulations including those relating to Medical and Aesthetic practices. We've compiled into easy-to-follow checklists to use as an initial guide.

# WASHINGTON STATE COMPLIANCE CHECKLIST

**Legal Entity:** Set up your legal entity.

- <u>Get started here</u> to set up your entity. LLC is the most common in Washington State.
  - Business Type (if asked) Medical Aesthetic Services or Personal Care
- Why LLC? This is because this entity will be acting as a non-healthcare manager of the PC. Consult with your accountant on individual tax objectives.
- Since a DBA is required, make sure your LLC name is different from what you plan to "do business as". *Example: LLC "Moxie LLC" // DBA "Moxie Aesthetics*"
- DBA: File for your DBA (assumed business name) \*Must be filed under PC Name
  - Complete the online filing process: <u>click here to start</u>. Scroll down to "register a trade name with My DOR"
    - LLC Name = your MSO name
    - Corporation Filing = Moxie PC
    - Do not use "Aesthetics, Botox, or Moxie" in your DBA name
- □ Prescriptive Delegation & Collaboration Requirements (NPs & PAs):
  - NPs: Standard NP <> MP collaboration agreement unless NP has full practice authority and own their own MedSpa
  - PAs:
    - A written <u>practice agreement (template)</u> completed by you and your MD is required to have at your facility. Use <u>this online portal</u> to complete & file your practice agreement with the WA Medical Commission.
    - Must apply to MQAC (Medical Quality Assurance Commission) for authorization to operate at a "remote site." from an MD. Their <u>contact info is here</u> for any assistance.

## □ RN Service Exclusion List

- Weight Loss
- Lasers
- \*\*Unless you have an MD or NP on-site during these services but moxie requires proof of this. Otherwise you cannot offer these services.
- Insurance: You are required to carry malpractice and general liability insurance (included in all Vouch policies, our preferred insurance provider). For help with your Vouch policy, contact Cierra Ramos: <u>cierra.ramos@vouch.us</u>
- ☐ Medical Waste: If you conduct medical waste management activities, you should note how to dispose of it properly.

- Sharps or syringes are not considered household hazardous waste and should be disposed of with regular trash pick up. Sharps should be placed in a puncture-resistant hard plastic or metal container.
- Close the container with its original lid and secure with heavy duty tape. Place the tightly sealed container in a paper bag and discard it with your household trash. Do not place it with your recyclables.
- □ **OSHA:** There are critical requirements that every MedSpa should follow when it comes to OSHA.
  - Understand OSHA here
  - Comply with the seven particular OSHA standards listed
  - <u>Bloodborne Pathogens</u> course Moxie recommends (\$10 and valid for one year)
  - If you have employees: Print out the <u>OSHA job safety and health poster</u> for your MedSpa

## □ Physical Signage:

- Make sure a copy of any business license and nursing license is posted in your MedSpa (we recommend in a hall on the way to the treatment room or where other notices are posted)
- We recommend posting your Medical Director's information in your MedSpa: Name, License Type (MD), License #
- If you have employees: Print out the <u>WA Labor Law Poster</u> for employee and customer visibility and hang in your breakroom
- Post a discrimination law sign within your MedSpa

## □ Marketing & Advertising Guidance

- Do not have any needles in any of your pictures. The Meta (owner of Facebook & Instagram) algorithm does not allow them
- Never 'boost' any images with needles, pharmaceutical products (inclusive of vials of Tox, botox, filler..), and before and afters
- Be sure to have signed photo waivers that allow you to use patient pictures for marketing that includes language around the patient waiving privacy.
- Videos on websites must have closed captioning capability for ADA compliance
- Ads cannot be false or misleading. Ads that use models must say it's a model
- Ads that use before or after photos must specify the treatment provided
